Date: 4.27.25 | Title: Jesus' Final Instructions and Ascension | Scripture: Matthew 28:16-20; Mark 16:14-20; Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:1-11

### LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING

#### PRESCHOOL:

- God sent Jesus to earth because He loves and cares about us.
- Jesus always obeyed God.
- Jesus died on the cross and then came back to life.
- Jesus is in heaven with God.

#### YOUNGER KIDS (K5-2ND GRADE):

- God planned for Jesus to be the Savior from the beginning of time.
- Jesus is the Messiah and the Savior.
- God provided a plan for salvation because He loves me.
- Jesus died to pay the penalty for all my sins- past, present and future.
- Salvation is the beginning of a growing relationship with Jesus that lasts forever. Through salvation my sin is forgiven and the gift of eternal life with God begins.
- Jesus ascended to heaven but promised He would return one day.

#### OLDER KIDS (3RD-5TH GRADE):

- God planned for Jesus to be the Savior from the beginning of time and sent Jesus to earth at the perfect time.
- Jesus taught that He is the only way to God.
- People cannot save themselves, Jesus died to pay the penalty for our sins, redeeming and rescuing us from sin and death.
- God's salvation is eternal. Nothing can separate Christians from God's love.
- Jesus' crucifixion, burial, and resurrection were a necessary part of God's plan for the forgiveness of sin.
- Jesus ascended to heaven but promised He would return one day.

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### **BUSY BIN**

As the kids arrive they will pick up a snack, a drink and the two Great Commission Activity sheets to work on as their friends arrive.



In your classroom there will be a directed drawing activity for you to walk your kids through. Tell the kids that they will be drawing a picture, but in order for it to turn out correctly they will need to listen to you and follow the instructions very carefully and accurately. Lead the kids through the drawing activity consistently reminding them to listen to you and follow the directions you give them. You can draw your own picture step by step alongside the kids so they will have a model to follow.

After the drawing, ask the kids the following question: How did you know how to draw such a great piece of art? How important was it to listen to my directions? How might things have turned out differently if you didn't listen and follow my directions? In our story today, we will learn that Jesus gave His disciples important instructions to follow before He went back to heaven.

### **BACKGROUND INFO FOR LEADERS**

After His resurrection, Jesus appeared to many people over a period of forty days. On one occasion, He appeared to a group of women in Jerusalem and instructed them to tell His eleven disciples (minus Judas) to meet Him in Galilee (Matthew 28:5-10).

A short time later, Jesus met the disciples on a mountain in Galilee. When they saw Him, some worshiped Him, while others were hesitant. There, Jesus gave them their mission—known as the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20).

In His resurrected state, Jesus had absolute authority over heaven and earth, affirming His deity. This authority was given to Him by the Father, showing that He remained subject to the Father's will. The central command of the Great Commission is to make disciples—calling people to commit to Jesus as their Master and Lord. This mission involves going to all nations, baptizing believers, and teaching them to follow His commands. Through this process, people would grow in faith, become sanctified, and live transformed, holy lives. Jesus' ministry in Israel was just the beginning of a global movement to share the gospel, reaching not only Jews but also Gentiles.

After appearing multiple times to His disciples, Jesus ascended into heaven (Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:1-3, 9-11). His departure brought uncertainty for His followers, who had to trust that God's plan would unfold as Jesus had promised. The New Testament writers emphasize the importance of this event as both the conclusion of Jesus' earthly ministry and the beginning of His heavenly ministry.

\*Jesus has now been exalted to "the right hand of God," which is a symbol of ultimate power as Lord and Christ where He reigns in glory (Psalm 110:1; Acts 2:32-36; 5:30-31; Ephesians 1:20-21; Philippians 2:8-11; 1 Timothy 3:16; Hebrews 1:3; 2:9; 10:12; 12:2; 1 Peter 3:22; Revelation 1:12-18; 3:21)

\*Jesus will pour out His Spirit to live within and empower His people (John 14:12; 16:4-7, 13; Acts 2:32-33)

\*Jesus gives gifts to the church to equip us for ministry (Ephesians 4:7-13)




\*As our faithful high priest, Jesus now intercedes for us (Romans 8:34; Hebrews 4:14; 6:19-20; 7:25; 8:1; 9:24)

\*Jesus is preparing a place for us (John 14:2)

### LOCATE THE SCRIPTURE & TELL THE STORY

Matthew 28:16-20; Mark 16:14-20; Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:1-11



Remind your group that we are now studying the New Testament. The first four books, the gospels, tell the story of Jesus' time as a man on earth from the voice of different authors. Today part of our story will come from the 5th book of the New Testament, Acts.

TELL THE STORY

Read directly from Scripture, use The Jesus Storybook Bible, The Biggest Story Bible, or the summary provided in the lesson



Put the events in order, draw a comic strip, build it with blocks or playdough, act it out, etc...

#### Tell the story:

Jesus came to earth and lived for 33 years until He died on the cross. Jesus is fully God and fully man. He never sinned and was the perfect sacrifice, dying on the cross for our sins. On the third day, Jesus rose from the dead, just as He had said He would. Jesus lived, died, and rose again so that we can know God and be saved from our sin. After His resurrection, Jesus spent 40 days with His followers. Before Jesus returned to His Father, He gave His disciples the mission of helping others know Him. Today, we will learn how Jesus gave His followers instructions on what to do after He went back to heaven and how they would be empowered to be His witnesses.

After Jesus died on the cross and was raised from the dead, He spent time with His disciples. At the end of His time on earth, Jesus gave His disciples important instructions. First, He told them not to leave the city of Jerusalem. Jesus said the disciples should wait there until God kept His promise to give them the Holy Spirit.

Jesus reminded the disciples of John the Baptist. John had baptized people with water when they turned away from their sin and turned to God. Jesus said that in a few days, the disciples would be baptized too. Not with water, but with the Holy Spirit.

"Lord, are You giving the kingdom back to Isreal now?" the disciples asked. God was with His people- the Jews- but they looked weak. The Romans ruled over them. The Jewish people wanted to have power over other nations.

Jesus did not say yes, but He did not say no. "The Father knows when the time is right," He said. Then Jesus said, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come on you. You will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

As Jesus' witnesses, the disciples would tell people what they knew to be true. They would tell people the good news about Jesus in the city of Jerusalem, in the surrounding area of Judea and the nearby area of Samaria, and all over the world. The Holy Spirit would be with them to help them.

After Jesus said these things, He went up to heaven. The disciples watched Jesus until a cloud hid Him from their sight. Suddenly, two men appeared. The men were wearing white clothes. These men asked the disciples, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up into heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven will come again. He will return in the same way that you have seen Him going into heaven."

Then the disciples returned to Jerusalem, as Jesus had instructed them, to pray and wait

Re-tell the Bible Story: put events in order, draw a comic strip, build it with blocks or playdough, act it out, etc.

Share the GOSPEL:

Even though Jesus was about to return to heaven, He promised that His followers would not be alone. He would send the Holy Spirit to help them as they shared the gospel. Everyone who believes in Jesus receives His Spirit. Just as the Holy Spirit empowered the early disciples to spread the gospel and establish churches, He also helps us today. The Holy Spirit comforts us, reveals our sin, and guides us to live for God's glory.

Jesus' Great Commission connects to God's earlier promise to Abraham in Genesis 12:3—that through him, all peoples on earth would be blessed. Now, after His death and resurrection, He commissions His followers to take His message of salvation to both Jews and Gentiles (Acts 26:23). This was Jesus' purpose on earth—to establish the kingdom of God. Revelation 7:9 confirms this vision, describing God's redeemed people as coming from "every nation, tribe, people, and language."

# **BOLY WEEK**

## ATTRIBUTES OF GOD

- ATTENTIVE God hears and responds to the needs of his children.
- COMPASSIONATE God cares for his children and acts on their behalf.
- **CREATOR God made everything. He is uncreated.**
- **DELIVERER** God rescues and saves his children.
- ETERNAL God is not limited by time. He exists outside of time.
- FAITHFUL God always keeps his promises.
- **GENEROUS** God gives what is best and beyond what is deserved.
- GLORIOUS God displays His greatness and worth.
- GOOD God is what is best and gives what is best. He is incapable of doing harm.
- HOLY God is perfect, pure, and without sin.
- IMMUTABLE/UNCHANGING God never changes. He is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow.
- INCOMPREHENSIBLE God is beyond our understanding. We can comprehend Him in part but not in whole.
- **INFINITE** God has not limits in His person or on His power.
- JEALOUS God will not share his glory with another. all glory rightfully belongs to him.
- JUST god is fair in all his actions and judgements. He cannot over-punish or under-punish.
- LOVING God feels and displays infinite, unconditional affection toward his children. His love for them does not depend on their worth, response, or merit.
- **MERCIFUL** God does not give his children the punishment they deserve.
- OMNIPOTENT/ALMIGHTY God holds all power. nothing is too hard for God. What He wills He can accomplish.

# **BOLY WEEK**

## ATTRIBUTES OF GOD

**OMNIPRESENT - God is fully present everywhere.** 

- OMNISCIENT God knows everything, past, present, and future all potential and real outcomes, all things micro and macro.
- PATIENT/LONG-SUFFERING God is untiring and bears with His children.
- **PROVIDER** God meets the needs of his children.
- **REFUGE God is a place of safety and protection for his children.**
- **RIGHTEOUS God is always good and right.**
- SELF-EXISTENT God depends on nothing and no one to give him life or existence.
- SELF-SUFFICIENT God is not vulnerable. He has no needs.
- SOVEREIGN God does everything according to HIs plan and pleasure.
- **TRANSCENDENT** God is not like humans. He is infinitely higher in being and action.
- **TRUTHFUL** Whatever God speaks or does is truth and reality.
- WISE God knows what is best and acts accordingly. He cannot choose wrongly.
- WORTHY God deserves all glory and honor and praise.
- WRATHFUL God hates all unrighteousness.

### QUESTIONS TO REBUILD THE STORY

1. After Jesus ascended into heaven, the disciples saw two men in white robes. What did these men tell the disciples? (Acts 1:11)

2. What did the disciples do after Jesus went away?

They obeyed Jesus' instructions and went back to Jerusalem like Jesus told them. They prayed and waited for the Holy Spirit. In their own power, the disciples would not be able to complete the mission of sharing the good news of Jesus with others. They Holy Spirit would later empower them and open hearts so people could see their sin and recognize their need to be saved through Jesus.

3. Is the promise of the Holy Spirit for all believers?

Yes! (Eph. 1:13) The Bible teaches us that when we receive salvation through Jesus, we are sealed with the Holy Spirit.

4. How does today's story encourage us?

As we live for Jesus, we are called to share the gospel with others. Thankfully, Jesus doesn't expect for us to do this alone and gives us the Holy Spirit to help us follow His instructions. Not only do we have the Holy Spirit as our Helper, but we have the promise that Jesus will come again.

**5.** Is the instruction to go and tell others about Jesus for a select group of people or for all believers? Why?

Jesus commanded all believers to go and share the good news with other people. We can share the gospel wherever we are. Be bold in your faith and share how Jesus has changed your life.

6. Who should we share the gospel with? Make a list of a few people close to you who need to hear God's Good News. What are some ways you can share with them this week?

7. What role does the Holy Spirit play in the life of a believer?

The Holy Spirit is the third part of God and Jesus. He is our Comforter, Helper, and Teacher.



- 8. What does this story teach me about God or the gospel?
- 9. What does the story teach me about myself?

10. Are there any commands in this story to obey? How are they for God's glory and my good?

**11.** Are there any promises in this story to remember? How do they help me trust and love God?

12. How does this story help me live on mission?

### PRAYER PROMPTS

Thank You Lord for Your promises. Thank You that You did not leave us alone, but have given us the Holy Spirit as our Helper. Help us to be faithful to share the good news with others.

#### IF TIME ALLOWS:

Practice naming the 4 Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Remind the kids that these books are in the NT and tell of Jesus' time on earth. Practice finding these books in the Bible.

Practice naming some of the disciples. During Wednesday night Bible study childcare, the kids learned a hokey song to remember all of the disciples. Play it a couple of times with your group and have them try to sing along.
