The Healthy Church sends her people into the world to project the life, love, and light of Jesus Christ.

Verse 1

Romans 13:1-7 - ¹ Let every person <u>be subject to the governing authorities</u>. For there is no authority except from God, and <u>those that exist have been instituted by God</u>. ² Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment. ³ For <u>rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad</u>. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval, ⁴ for <u>he is God's servant for your good</u>. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for <u>he does not bear the sword in vain</u>. For <u>he is the servant of God</u>, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer. ⁵ Therefore <u>one must be in subjection</u>, not only to avoid God's wrath but also <u>for the sake of conscience</u>. ⁶ For because of this <u>you also pay taxes</u>, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing. ⁷ Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, <u>respect to whom respect is owed</u>, <u>honor to whom honor is owed</u>.

The Healthy Church raises the best citizens, those who refuse political agitation.

Eight thoughts related to God, the Christian, and the Government:

- God institutes all human governments, no matter how they came into power.
- God mandates rulers to punish bad behavior and at the minimum recognize good behavior.
- God authorizes rulers to exercise power over life and death in order to get this done.
- God wants His children to submit as good citizens no matter who is in power.
- God authorizes rulers to raise taxes in order to support what they do.
- God wants His children to go along with whatever governing He allows.
- God wants His children to respect those who are governing, even when there is a disagreement.
- God wants His children to ask Him to provide rulers with what they need to promote civil unity and peace.

1 Timothy 2:1-2 - ¹ First of all, then, I urge that <u>supplications</u>, <u>prayers</u>, <u>intercessions</u>, <u>and thanksgivings</u> <u>be made for all people</u>, ² for <u>kings</u> and <u>all who are in high positions</u>, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.

1 Peter 2:17 - Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor.

Ezra 7:27-28 - ²⁷ Blessed be the LORD, the God of our fathers, who put such a thing as this into the heart of the king, to beautify the house of the LORD that is in Jerusalem, ²⁸ and who extended to me his steadfast love before the king and his counselors, and before all the king's mighty officers. I took courage, for the hand of the LORD my God was on me, and I gathered leading men from Israel to go up with me.
