Romans 5:8 - but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Verses 13-15

John 19:2 - And the soldiers twisted together <u>a crown of thorns and put it on his head</u> and arrayed him in a purple robe.

Exodus 24:8 - And Moses took the blood and threw it on the people and said, "Behold the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words."

Leviticus 16:14-15 - ¹⁴ And he shall take some of the <u>blood</u> of the bull and sprinkle it with his finger on the front of the mercy seat on the east side, and in front of the mercy seat he shall sprinkle some of the <u>blood</u> with his finger seven times. ¹⁵ "Then he shall kill the goat of the sin offering that is for the people and bring its <u>blood</u> inside the veil and do with its <u>blood</u> as he did with the <u>blood</u> of the bull, sprinkling it over the mercy seat and in front of the mercy seat.

Hebrews 9:22 - Indeed, under the law <u>almost everything is purified with blood</u>, and <u>without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins.</u>

Revelation 5:9-10 - ⁹ And they sang a new song, saying, "Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and <u>by your blood you ransomed people for God</u> from every tribe and language and people and nation, ¹⁰ and you have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they shall reign on the earth."

1 Corinthians 1:18 - For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

While we were repulsed by Jesus, He acted according to the Father's plan.

Verses 1-3

Luke 2:52 - And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man.

1 Samuel 9:2 – And he had a son whose name was <u>Saul</u>, <u>a handsome young man</u>. There was not a man among the people of Israel more handsome than he. From his shoulders upward <u>he was taller</u> than any of the people.

1 Samuel 16:12 – And he sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy and had beautiful eyes and was handsome. And the LORD said, "Arise, anoint him, for this is he."

John 1:11 – He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him.

John 1:14 – And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and <u>we have seen his glory</u>, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

John 10:33 – The Jews answered him, "It is not for a good work that we are going to stone you but for blasphemy, because you, being a man, make yourself God."

Mark $1:32-34-^{32}$ That evening at sundown they brought to him all who were sick or oppressed by demons. ³³ And the whole city was gathered together at the door. ³⁴ And <u>he healed many who were sick with various diseases</u>, and cast out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

Mark 3:9-10 - ⁹ And he told his disciples to have a boat ready for him because of the crowd, lest they crush him, ¹⁰ for he had healed many, so that all who had diseases pressed around him to touch him.

While we were ignorant of Jesus, He embraced rejection.

Verse 4-6

Psalm 32:1-4 - ¹ Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.

Judges 16:1-3 - ¹ Samson went to Gaza, and there he saw a prostitute, and he went in to her. ² The Gazites were told, "Samson has come here." And they surrounded the place and set an ambush for him all night at the gate of the city. They kept quiet all night, saying, "Let us wait till the light of the morning; then we will kill him." ³ But <u>Samson</u> lay till midnight, and at midnight <u>he arose and took hold of the doors of the gate of the city and the two posts, and pulled them up, bar and all, and put them on his shoulders and carried them to the top of the hill that is in front of Hebron.</u>

Deuteronomy 21:23 – his body shall not remain all night on the tree, but you shall bury him the same day, for <u>a hanged man is cursed by God</u>. You shall not defile your land that the Lord your God is giving you for an inheritance.

Galatians 3:13 - <u>Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us</u>—for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree"

Mankind:

- Saturated in sin
- Deserving of death
- Embattled with God
- Desperate for healing

1 Corinthians 15:22 - For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.

1 Peter 2:25 - For <u>you were straying like sheep</u> but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

H.E. Guillebaud – Thus God proclaimed His infinite abhorrence of sin by being willing to suffer all that, in place of the guilty ones, in order that He might justly forgive.

While we were unfaithful to Jesus, He died for us.

² Blessed is the man against whom the LORD counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

³ For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long.

⁴ For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer.

Verses 7-9

Andrew Davis – God would rather slaughter His own beloved Son than allow guilty sinners like us into Heaven

Job 9:3 - If one wished to contend with him, one could not answer him once in a thousand times.

John 19:6-10 - ⁶ When the chief priests and the officers saw him, they cried out, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him, for I find no guilt in him." ⁷ The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has made himself the Son of God." ⁸ When Pilate heard this statement, he was even more afraid. ⁹ He entered his headquarters again and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. ¹⁰ So Pilate said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have authority to release you and authority to crucify you?"

Romans 5:19 - For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous.

John 19:38-41 – ³⁸ After these things <u>Joseph of Arimathea</u>, who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took away his body. ³⁹ Nicodemus also, who earlier had come to Jesus by night, came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds in weight. ⁴⁰ So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. ⁴¹ Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. ⁴² So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, since the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there.

Luke 23:32 – *Two others, who were criminals,* were led away to be put to death with him.

1 Peter 2:22 – He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth.

Hebrews 12:2 – looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

While we were guilty instead of Jesus, He remained silent.

Verses 10-12

Revelation 7:9 - After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands.

While we were lost without Jesus, He brought us to His Father.

Philippians 2:9-11 - ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

What can we do?

- Personally acknowledge our need of Jesus' work
- Worshipfully adore Jesus' work
- Mentally do the <u>work</u> to discover Jesus' <u>work</u>
- Evangelistically share Jesus' <u>work</u> with others
- Eternally look forward to being a completed version of Jesus' work

1 John 3:2 - Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is.
